
## A Guide to the High School Feedback Profile

#### **INTRODUCTION**

The High School Feedback Profile displays the demographic characteristics, assessment performance, and post-secondary enrollment information of students from a specified 4-year graduation cohort. This report is available for 4-Year Graduation Cohorts, beginning with the 2011 cohort and beyond.

- Users can select to view high school graduate or non-graduate student populations in the High School Feedback Profile.
- This report matches NJ SMART students in a graduation cohort year to the National Student Clearinghouse
  (NSC) database of reported post secondary enrollees. Users may select an available NSC extract date from the
  Report Selection Criteria page.
- The Post-Secondary data included in this profile is reflective of a student's first enrollment in a post-secondary institution. If a student enrolls in multiple institutions, only the first enrollment will be represented in the High School Feedback Profile.
- The August 31<sup>st</sup> snapshot, which is collected exclusively for graduation related information, will be the only snapshot available for the High School Feedback Profile.
- Local Data Mart data is not available for this report. NJ ASK performance data is provided for 3<sup>rd</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade assessments only. Only the highest HSPA score is displayed.

#### REPORT DESCRIPTION

- REPORT DESCRIPTION
  - **REPORT HEADER** displays the report name, the selected snapshot year, the NSC extract date, the date that the report was generated, CDS Perspective (accountable or attending), district name, school name, the 4-Year Graduation Cohort Year, and the High School Student Population (graduates or non-graduates).
  - **TOTAL GRADUATES/NON-GRADUATES (COLUMNS)** display the High School student population selected from the Report Selection Criteria page (High School Graduates or non-Graduates). The First two columns in the profile let the user know how many students (Graduates or Non-Graduates) are in the report, and if they went to a post-secondary institution. The tables below define what students appear in each column. The left side outlines who is in the graduate student population and the right outlines who is in the non-graduate student population.
    - Total Graduates displays the number of students in the selected cohort who were submitted as graduates in the August 31st snapshot's adjusted 4-year graduation cohort count. This is any student with a student exit withdrawal code of L or PG. The percentage of Total Graduates is equivalent to a school's adjusted graduation rate.
    - Total Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary displays the number of graduates in the chosen cohort who enrolled in a Post Secondary institution according to the National Student Clearinghouse. The percentage of Total Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary is equal to the # of Total Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary divided by the # of Total Graduates.
- Total Non-Graduates displays the number of students in the given cohort indicated as nongraduates in the August 31st snapshot's adjusted cohort count. This includes students with any exit witdrawal code other than L or PG who are not excluded from the graduation cohort.
- Total Non-Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary displays the number of non-graduates in the chosen cohort who enrolled in a Post Secondary institution according to the National Student Clearinghouse. The percentage of Total Non-Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary is equal to the # of Total Non-Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary divided by the # of Total Non-Graduates.
- Post Secondary Enrollment Characteristics (Columns):
  - Graduates Enrolled in In-State vs. Out-of-State Institutions compares the number of graduates enrolled in Post-Secondary Institutions in the state of NJ to those enrolled out-of-state according to the National Student Clearinghouse. The percentage of Graduates Enrolled in In-State (or Out-of-State) Institutions is equal to the # of Graduates Enrolled in In-State (or Out-of-State) Institutions divided by the # of Total Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary.
- Non-Graduates Enrolled in In-State vs. Out-of-State Institutions compares the number of non-graduates enrolled in Post-Secondary Institutions in the state of NJ to those enrolled out-of-state according to the National Student Clearinghouse. The percentage of Non-Graduates Enrolled in In-State (or Out-of-State) Institutions is equal to the # of Non-Graduates Enrolled in In-State (or Out-of-State) Institutions divided by the # of Total Non-Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary.

## A Guide to the High School Feedback Profile

- Graduates Enrolled in 4-Year vs. 2-Year Institutions compares the number of graduates enrolled in 4 year Institutions to those enrolled in 2 year institutions according to the National Student Clearinghouse. The percentage of Graduates Enrolled in 4-Year (or 2-Year) Institutions is equal to the # of Graduates Enrolled in 4-Year (or 2-Year) Institutions divided by the # of Total Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary.
- Graduates Enrolled in Public vs. Private Institutions compares the number of graduates enrolled in Public Institutions to Private institutions according to the National Student Clearinghouse. The percentage of Graduates Enrolled in Public (or Private) Institutions is equal to the # of Graduates Enrolled in Public (or Private) Institutions divided by the # of Total Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary.
- Graduates Enrolled in Post-Secondary within 16 months of receiving High School Diploma displays graduates who enrolled in a Post Secondary institution within 16 months of the August 31st Snapshot. The percentage of Graduates Enrolled in Post-Secondary within 16 months of receiving a High School Diploma is equal to the # of Graduates Enrolled in Post-Secondary within 16 months of receiving a High School Diploma divided by the # of Total Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary.

- Institutions compares the number of nongraduates enrolled in 4 year Institutions to those enrolled in 2 year institutions according to the National Student Clearinghouse. The percentage of Non-Graduates Enrolled in 4-Year (or 2-Year) Institutions is equal to the # of Graduates Enrolled in 4-Year (or 2-Year) Institutions divided by the # of Total Non-Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary.
- Institutions compares the number of non graduates enrolled in Public Institutions to those enrolled in Private institutions according to the National Student Clearinghouse. The percentage of Non-Graduates Enrolled in Public (or Private) Institutions is equal to the # of Non-Graduates Enrolled in Public (or Private) the # of Total Non-Graduates Enrolled in Post Secondary.

**Row Subgroups** can be clicked to filter the report population to the group of students selected. Filtering allows the user to more easily examine a disaggregated group of students in the report. The available subgroups are:

- School
- Grade Level

- Entering Lunch Status
- Entering Special Education
- Limited English Proficient Status
- Entering Migrant Status
- Entering Homeless Status
- Time in District

#### Notes:

- 1. Subgroups that specify "entering" are the subgroup indicators officially reported to the NJ DOE for graduation rates. Therefore, for these specific variables, the High School Feedback Profile displays the values first assigned to the students upon entry into the graduation cohort. Entering Values are only displayed in graduation-related district reports.
- 2. Discipline, Credits Earned, and Program Enrollment are optional submission elements and will only appear in the profile if the district chooses to upload these data.
- **REPORT FEATURES:** The High School Feedback Profile presents a starting point for further data analysis and includes:
  - Ability to view aggregate student counts from NJ SMART snapshot data across multiple submissions, and disaggregated across multiple categories.
  - Ability to drill down from aggregate counts to a detailed Student List that displays key data for students.
  - Ability to drill down from the Student List to detailed Student Enrollment and Assessment Records that provide history and in-depth information from across various submissions and school years for individual students.
  - Ability to download a Student List Extract into Excel that provides additional columns in a student list containing almost every NJ SMART element submitted for the list of students.
  - Ability to export all reports into Excel for further analysis and printing.

To take advantage of these features, select the hyperlinked fields in the High School Feedback Profile to drill to a new level or perform a report function such as an export.
